

Age: 6-14 years



#### Life Stage III

Focus: Skilled and involved youth

Age: 15-24 years

#### **Disability Inclusion**

Children and youth with disabilities represent some of the most vulnerable communities and our programs work to ensure that these individuals are absorbed into the community through community-based rehabilitation programs that address, the livelihood, rehabilitation, and medical needs of persons with disabilities.



#### Advocacy

Through our programs, we advocate for policy implementation and changes in systems to educate our communities about their rights and make informed decisions to thrive in their lives. ChildFund Sri Lanka is a longstanding advocate for the rights of children with disabilities.



#### **Gender Equality**

As an organization, we place an emphasis on looking at equal ease of access to resources and opportunities regardless of gender, including economic participation and decision-making in all our program interventions.



#### Social Inclusion

We pledge to work with different groups of participants and groups, despite their ethnicity, and race, geographical inclusion, sexual preference, age, abilities, etc.
